It could be a pilot, a factory worker, a code-cracker for Bletchley park etc</p>	<p>Make your own propaganda art piece encouraging people to join in with the war efforts.</p>	<p>Write a diary entry from the perspective of an evacuee. What are your thoughts, feelings, dreams etc?</p>
<p>Have a go at your own make-do and mend project. Can you upcycle some old clothing like they used to in the war?</p>	<p>Write a newspaper report about the war breaking out. Think about the cause, who is involved, which countries are fighting etc</p>	<p>Research and report on why poppies are used to symbolise remembrance and are worn on Remembrance Day.</p>
