


On February 6<sup>th</sup> 1952 the king died, aged just 56, in his sleep in Sandringham House Norfolk. It took more than 4 hours for the news to filter through to Africa. By then Elizabeth and her husband Philip had returned to Sapana Lodge, a farm near Nairobi that had been given to them as a wedding present. Phillip took her into the garden and walked her slowly as she absorbed the full implication of what had happened. Agen only 25 and far from home she was not only Queen but head of state. Since then she was a great role model to us and the commonwealth and she will be long remembered. She has been an example to us all and we hope the new King will have a long and successful reign for many, many years.



Andrea Shepherd burst on to the scene as an author. She has spoken to our reading club. Here is some of the interview she gave. 'Hello to all the rocking readers at Finlay School & welcome to the superhero squad, I hope you enjoy reading about Tomas and all the dragons he grows, I certainly had a lot of fun writing this series. I love dreaming up all the different dragons that grow on the tree and often get inspired by real animals.'

What other stuff do you do in life apart from writing books?
I love water so I do a lot of swimming - outside if I can - and walking by the river or sea. I think I might be part mermaid!

How hard is it to think of things to write down in your books?

If you give yourself time to think – and actually get bored – ideas usually pop into our heads. Our brain likes to make stuff up to keep us entertained. I think everyone gets ideas all the time, the trick is to notice them! And then write them down.

### What age did you become a proper author?

I didn't start trying to get published until my sons had gone to school, I was forty-two.

### What inspired you to start writing books?

I've always loved stories and playing with language. For a long time I was too scared to start writing properly, I kept thinking what if I try and fail? But then I decided that it was better to have a go than never try.

### What is your favourite time of day?

Oh dear another favourite! Tricky... I think probably tea-time when we all sit down together and eat and however busy we've been we can catch up.

### What is your favourite author?

I love David Almond – Skellig is a favourite of mine. And Katherine Rundell who wrote The Explorer and Rooftoppers, I love her writing. Also Kiran Millwood Hargrave and Sophie Anderson. My favourite illustrators are Catherine Rayner, John Burningham and of course Sara Ogilvie who illustrates my books.
