HOW TO GET STARTED?


In boxing, your stance, if you are right handed, is your left foot forward and right foot back. But if you are left handed, you need to put your right foot forward and left foot back.

What is the youngest age you can play professionally?


There is no official age but you must have finished secondary school three years ago to be able to play professionally.

Rugby player who became an NFL player.





Centre	Allowed in all thirds, but not in either shooting circle	
Wing Attack	Allowed in the attacking and centre thirds, but not the shooting circle	
Goal Attack	Allowed in the attacking and centre thirds, and the shooting circle	
Goal Shooter	Allowed in the attacking goal third and shooting circle



BAKING COOKIES

WITH REMAYAH

Ingredients

- 1. 150g salted butter, softened
- 2. 80g light brown Muscovado sugar
- 3. 80g granulated sugar
- 4. 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 5. 1 large egg
- 6. 225g plain flour
- 7. 1/2 teaspoon bicarbonate of soda
- 8. 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 9. 200g plain chocolate chips



Method

- 1. Heat oven to 190 degrees / fan 170 degrees and line 2 baking sheets with non-stick baking paper.
- 2. Put 150g softened salted butter, 80g light brown

Muscovado sugar and 80g granulated sugar into a bowl and beat until it's creamy.

- 3. Beat in 2 teaspoons of vanilla extract and 1 large egg.
- 4. Sift 225g plain flour, 1/2 teaspoon bicarbonate of soda and 1/4 teaspoon of salt into the bowl and mix it with a wooden spoon.
- 5. Add 200g plain chocolate chips or chunks and stir well.
- 6. Use a teaspoon to put small scoops of the mixture onto the baking tray.
- 7. Bake for 12 minutes.
- 8. Leave to cool and then decorate!

ANIMALS WITH AIMEE

KAKAPOS

Kakapos are usually found in New Zealand.

They are sometimes known as the Owl Parrot.

They are large, nocturnal, ground-dwelling parrots and their main diet is plants.



Dugongs are marine mammals, which are sometimes known as Sea Cows!

Dugongs are closely related to elephants.

They are vegetarian and like to eat seagrass.

They can stay underwater for up to six minutes without breathing!

They live in warm coastal waters near East Africa and Australia.

Dugongs spend much of their time either alone or in a pair.







Axolotls are a type of salamander. Amazingly, they use both gills and lungs to breathe!

Remarkably, Axolotls are only found in one location on Earth (near Mexico City in North America).

Weirdly, they have no teeth and use a strong sucking force to devour their prey!

ANTARCTICA'S WEIRD AND CUTE ANIMALS WITH ELLA

Antarctica - the world of new discoveries and funky animals.

All animals have adapted to their habitats meaning even adorable seals were not always as cute and chunky as before.

How many animals can you think of that live in Antarctica?



On land, they are quite ungainly but in the water they are very graceful and are excellent swimmers. Seals are well adapted to cold, polar environments with thick blubber layers that act both as a food reserve and insulation. Most seals also have a layer of fur, giving additional insulation on land.

ANTARCTICA WITH

ELLA

- Antarctica is, on average, the coldest, driest, and windiest of the continents, and it has the highest average elevation.
- It is mainly a polar desert, with annual precipitation of over 200mm along the coast and far less inland.
- About 70% of the world's freshwater reserves are frozen in Antarctica, which, if melted, would raise global sea levels by almost 60 metres (200 ft).
- Antarctica holds the record for the lowest measured temperature on Earth, -89.2 °C. The coastal regions can reach temperatures over 10 °C in the summer.
- Native animals include mites, nemat odes, penguins, seals and tardigrades.
- Where vegetation occurs, it is mostly in the form of lichen or moss.



WATERWAYS MUSEUM


WITH MUNA

Me and the rest of the Year 4's went to The Waterways Museum in Gloucester Quays to learn more about the River Severn and the Gloucester and Sharpness Canal.

First, we learned about the history of rivers. Did you know the River Severn is the longest river in Britain? It flows for 220 miles from The Cambrian Mountains in Wales to the Bristol Channel.

An adze (old cutting tool) was used to shape timber (wood) to make the boats that travelled along the canal, which is still used today. The boats were used to transport goods such as coal, grain, salt and chocolate. The goods were then stored in the warehouses at Gloucester Docks.

We learnt about the materials used for diving suits in the olden days and we had a go at lifting sacks by pulling ropes - we tested the different types of ropes. We learnt that horses used to pull the barge boats along the canal before motors were invented.



Around the World With Alfred: Peru!

The name of Peru is likely derived from 'Biru' (the name of a local ruler who lived in the Bay of San Miguel). Peru is located in the west coast of South America, bordering Ecuador, Colombia, Chile, Bolivia and the vast, diverse country of Brazil. After being conquered by the Spanish in the 1500s, around three centuries later, it gained independence. With a history as colossal as its biodiversity, Peru is a tropical Garden of Eden, with secrets waiting to be explored...



MACHU PICCHU

Machu Picchu, located in southern Peru, is a towering place of wonder, formerly a Incan citadel. It is often referred as 'The Lost City Of The Incas 'and in 1983, declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Fourteen years after being recognised as such, it was voted one of the new Seven Wonders Of The World and is the most

famous of the Incan remains.

In the Quechua language, Machu means old or old person, whilst Picchu is roughly translated to pyramid, pointed or cone. Theoretically, Machu Picchu translates to old pyramid, possibly meaning the Incas didn't originally build it...

BIODIVERSITY

With around 25,000 unique species of plants, 523 mammals, 1,487 birds, 624 amphibians and 2145 species of fish, Peru is a 'megadiverse' country with wildlife teeming in every nook and cranny. From the Andean Condor to the Vicuna, Peru has large amounts of animals, anywhere



A particularly intriguing animal in Peru is the Spectacled Bear, which gets its name from the rings surrounding its

eyes. It is a relatively small species of bear and its numbers are dwindling. It is also the only species of bear in South America.

The national bird of Peru is the Andean Cock Of the Rock. This animal is found in tropical/subtropical climates near rocky areas, where it constructs its nests. They have a distinct plumage and are known for their vivid red colouring.

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
