David Attenborough


Some of David's family members include: his late wife Jane Elizabeth Ebsworth Oriel, his son Robert Attenborough, his brother John Attenborough and his daughter Susan Attenborough. David's older brother Richard Attenborough later became a successful actor and film producer.



From and early age, David developed a strong interest in natural history. As earlier mentioned, he was educated at Clair college, Cambridge (M.A, 1947), and began work at an educational publishing house in 1949. In 1952, he completed a training program at the British Broadcasting Corporation (BBC) and became a television producer for the BBC. Together with reptile curator Jack Lester, in 1954, he made the television series Zoo Quest, in which live animals were filmed in the wild and in zoos.

In 1965, Attenborough became controller of the BBC's new second television channel, BBC-2. In this capacity, he helped launch the dramatic production <u>The Forsythe Saga</u> and such landmark cultural-educational series Jacob Bronowski's <u>The Ascent of Man</u> and Kenneth Clark's <u>civilisation</u>. He has also aired the seminal comedy series Monty Python's Flying Circus. Attenborough was director of the BBC from 1968 to 1972, but he resigned to write and produce television series on freelance basis.





He subsequently wrote (and narrated) a succession of award-winning television programs on anthropology and natural history, most notably the life series: Life on Earth (1979), The Living Planet (1984), The Trials of Life (1990), Life in the Freezer (1993), The Private Life of Plants (1995), The Life of Birds (1998), The Life of Mammals (2002–03), Life in the Undergrowth (2005), and Life in Cold Blood (2008). His other TV credits included The Blue Planet (2001), an exploration of the world's oceans, and State of the Planet (2000) and Are We Changing Planet Earth? (2006), both of which dealt heavily with environmental issues. He has just released a new film called 'Ocean,' which I am looking forward to watching.


The History

of Cubs

You can join Cubs at the age of eight until you are ten and a half years of age. Originally, Cubs began in 1916 as **Wolf Cubs**, the section gained its current name in 1966.

Between 2002 and 2015, the Cub Scout logo consisted of a lowercase 'cubs' in green with a pawprint. The current UK Cub Scouts logo features a simplified fleur-de-lis, which is a compass-like shape, along with two stars, a bond, and a circular rope with a reef knot

Cub scout uniform



Cubs are often taught simple Scout skills such as tracking, First Aid, simple knots, orienteering and camping skills. They wear a simple uniform of a green cap and dark green or blue jersey.

Cub Scouting began in 1916 when "Junior Scouts" became "Wolf Cubs". The Original activities were constantly being changed and developed until, in 1966, a number of major changes were introduced into the Scout Movement as a whole and "Wolf Cubs" became "Cub Scouts".

The Cub Scout section, initially called Wolf Cubs, was launched in 1916 by Robert Baden-Powell as a program for younger boys, inspired by Rudyard Kipling's "The Jungle Book" and designed to encourage their physical, mental, and spiritual development.



Ancient animals



Diplocaulus means double stalk and had a boomerang-like head and roamed North America and Africa.

It was an amphibian.



Chungkingosaurus was a herbivorous dinosaur from the stegosauria suborder and gets its name from the location of its discovery, Chongqing in Sichuan, China. At around 9m in length, Chungkingosaurus was one of the smaller Stegosauria, with distinctive spikes adorning its neck, back and tail that helped it to protect itself from predators.





Easily recognised thanks to its blunt beak and the small horn on its forehead (its name directly translates into English as 'small-horned'), Microceratus was an herbivorous dinosaur that lived around 65-85 million years ago during the Cretaceous period. This genus walked on two legs and grows up to 80 centimetres in length - making it one of the smallest dinosaurs the world has seen.

Platybelodon, also known as "flat tusk", was a prehistoric animal that lived in the late Miocene period, around 10 million years ago. Based on evidence, scientists have determined that the Platybelodon inhabited marshy or swampy regions in Africa, Asia, and Caucasus. These environments likely provided an abundance of vegetation, which formed the primary component of its diet. Platybelodon was semiaquatic and fed in swampy environment of the grassy savannah regions.

Weighing around seven tonnes and growing up to around 11m in length, Deinocheirus was the largest ornithomimosaur ever to have existed. This genus dates back approximately 70m years to the late Cretaceous period and its name translates as 'horrible hand', in reference to its large, powerful claws.






Concavenator
