

Elves love sugary foods like cookies and candy canes and have their own secret language called "Elvish".

Santa Claus is the legendary, jolly, redsuited gift-giver for children at Christmas, evolving from the historical <u>Saint Nicho-</u> <u>las</u>, a 4th-century bishop known for generosity, whose Dutch name Sinterklaas morphed into "Santa Claus" in America, combining with figures like England's <u>Father</u> <u>Christmas</u>. He lives at the North Pole with his wife, Mrs. Claus, elves, and reindeer,





Reindeer are unique deer known for both males and females growing antlers, having fur-lined noses, and eyes that change colour seasonally. Adapted for cold climates with thick, hollow-haired coats and wide hooves, they are excellent swimmers and migrate vast distances, surviving on plants and "reindeer moss" (lichen). They're social herd animals, with calves able to walk



You may also receive presents from your family and friends.


Fun Facts
